A Journey Through the Life and Legacy of Dolly Parton

Tuesday, July 25th 6:30pm (CWC House) \$75 pp

One of the most beloved and multi-talented vocal artists of all time, Dolly Parton is an icon of Country Western music who rose to become a superstar of American pop culture. Composer/Producer EDWARD BARNES explores the life, artistry and business skills of this brightly spirited lady who turned her humble beginnings into an entertainment empire. Using vintage video and audio clips, along with projected visuals of her life and music, Edward traces Dolly's path as she sings and writes her way from the backwoods of the Appalachian Mountains to Nashville, Broadway, Hollywood, and the White House. Discover the joy, generosity, and smarts behind one of the world's most popular entertainers, and find out why, as she sang in her hit song from 1966, "this dumb blonde ain't nobody's fool."

A Journey Through the Life and Legacy of Aretha Franklin

Wednesday, July 26th 6:30pm (CWC House) \$75 pp

Composer/Producer EDWARD BARNES explores the life, craft, and innovative vocal styles of one of the most legendary and iconic singers in American popular music: Aretha Franklin. From her childhood days as the prodigal daughter of a renown Baptist preacher in Detroit, through her early work as a Gospel and jazz singer, then rising up to become the multi award-winning powerhouse and "Queen of Soul", Edward uses vintage video and audio clips, projected imagery, and piano demos to detail the story and talents of this great and deeply spiritual musical lady. Interwoven with her story is a look at the musical components of Gospel and Soul, as well as an understanding of how Aretha explored and expanded the vocabulary of her field and made musical history with her recordings and performances. Discover why her singular voice, which mesmerized congregations when she was seven and brought tears to the eyes of US Presidents when she was 73, remains one of the most profound and resonate today.

Dr. Vino Events - Summer 2023

Tyler Colman, Ph.D., aka Dr. Vino, has led 33 Virtual Wine Tastings for CWC since 2020. His doctoral dissertation at Northwestern University was on the political economy of the wine industry in France and the US. The author of two wine books and the wine pairing selections for "The Tucci Cookbook," he was a finalist for the James Beard Foundation award. Tyler taught wine classes for ten years at NYU and at the University of Chicago. He is a contributing editor for Wine & Spirits magazine and has appeared in The New York Times, Food & Wine, The World of Fine Wine, Forbes, the Oxford Companion to Wine, and even Bicycling Magazine. Tyler enjoys private consulting and connecting people with the wines they love.

Sicily Wines: Ready to Meet the Moment (of White Lotus) Thursday, July 20th at 5pm (CWC House) - \$50 pp



Sicily has emerged as one of the hottest regions in the wine world. This is thanks to Mt. Etna, the tallest active volcano in Europe, which has mineral-rich soil along its slopes. We will taste two compelling wines, a white and a red, from the Etna region as well as a full-bodied red from the interior of this incredible island. "White Lotus" viewing beforehand is optional!

Loire Valley: Fairy-tale Castles and Dreamy Wines

Join us for a vinous exploration of the Loire Valley! This stunning French region is known for fairy-tale castles and as the ancestral homeland of sauvignon blanc in Sancerre. We will conclude with a rare red from a 70-year-old vines.
