Edward Barnes: The Tina Turner Story

Monday, July 22nd 5-6:30pm (CWC House) \$75 pp

Known as the "Queen of Rock 'n Roll", Tina Turner was one of the most successful and admired pop-rock artists in American history. A singer, songwriter and actress, she rose from humble beginnings as the daughter of a Tennessee sharecropper to become one of the best-selling recording artists of all time, with over 100 million records sold. Edward Barnes tracks Tina's professional and personal ups and downs, from her initial success with husband Ike on hits like "River Deep, Mountain High" (1966) and "Proud Mary" (1971); through her struggles to establish herself as a solo artist in the mid-70s, with appearances on "The Hollywood Squares", "The Brady Bunch" and the film version of The Who's "Tommy"; to staging one of the greatest come-backs of all time with a stylistic evolution into international dance pop and the mega-hits "Private Dancer" (1983) "What's Love Got To Do With It?" (1984) and "We Don't Need Another Hero" (1985). This lecture examines Tina's voice, her technical approach to singing, the musical elements of her style, and the business dealings which dealt her both financial blows and astronomical success.

Edward Barnes: An Affair To Remember Veronica Bennett, Phil Spector & the making of "BE MY BABY"

Tuesday, July 23rd 5-6:30pm (CWC House) \$75 pp

Early 60s rock-n-roll, girl groups, Santa Monica Boulevard recording studios and an illicit love affair between a Washington Heights teenager and a crazy genius L.A. record producer. The story of 19 year-old singer Veronica ("Ronnie") Bennett, who in 1963 became the musical and romantic obsession of the eccentric but gifted Phil Spector and gave voice to the rock classic BE MY BABY. Producer-Composer Edward Barnes takes a behind-the-scenes look at the "bad girl" from New York who inspired such passion in Spector that he turned his songwriting skills and recording studio into a powerhouse of creativity, manipulating his band, backup vocalists and tape decks in imaginative and innovative new ways to showcase her talent. The resulting multi-million selling BE MY BABY, not only captured Ronnie's love but was a milestone in the evolution of rock, forever changing the music industry and the very concept of what a record could be. The truth behind an unusual romance and what Rolling Stone calls "one of the most influential songs ever written".

Dr. Vino Events - Summer 2024

Tyler Colman, Ph.D. (aka Dr. Vino) connects people with wines they love. The author of two wine books and a finalist for the James Beard Foundation award, he taught wine classes for ten years at NYU and five years at the University of Chicago. Tyler's wine writing has appeared in The New York Times, Wine & Spirits, Food & Wine, The World of Fine Wine, Forbes, the Oxford Companion to Wine, and even Bicycling magazine. Tyler is now a consultant to private collectors as well as restaurant wine programs. He recently started offering custom wine tours, and he hopes you can join him on a trip soon! Dr. Vino Blind Tasting: France vs. America Thursday, August 8th at 5-6:30pm (CWC House) - \$75 pp

The Olympics in France gives a perfect springboard for getting a "10" - in wine tasting! We will sharpen our wine tasting skills by tasting three pairs of wines (both white and red) that have one from France and one from America. Over the course of the tasting, we will touch on important wine regions and producers in each country.

Dr. Vino: Blue Zones, Red Wine Friday, August 9th at 5-6:30pm (CWC House) - \$50 pp

Longevity expert Dan Buettner has traveled to five areas around the world that have large concentrations of centenarians, or people over 100 years old. He originally wrote about them in National Geographic 20 years ago and recently had a show on Netflix called "Live to 100: Secrets from the Blue Zones" (We recommend the show as a backgrounder for this session). Wine, specifically red wine, is considered a key part of these "secrets." In our session, we will discuss the health benefits of wine (as well as recent pushback) while tasting a Cannonau from Sardinia, which Buettner favors. Additionally, we will taste a compelling white and a biodynamic red wine. Join us for this substantive tasting and discussion!

Dr. Vino's Tour de France: Wine Edition Saturday, August 10th at 5:30-7:30pm (CWC House) - \$175 pp

With all eyes on the Paris Olympics, we will embark on a vinous journey of France from the friendly confines of the CWC. Guests for this dinner will start the evening with a reception bubbly on the front porch and then move inside for a three-course meal with three pairs of wines. In the glass, we will examine three leading wine regions - the Loire Valley, Burgundy, and the Rhone - with a white and a red from each. Guests will gain an understanding of what makes these regions so exciting today and perhaps with a bit of joie de vivre as well.

Buffalo Bound: Art, History & Camaraderie A Day of Discovery and Delight

Thursday, August 22nd 9am-5pm - \$175 pp

Spend the day with CWC in Buffalo! We will take a private tour of the AKG Art Museum, have lunch at the Twentieth Century Club of Buffalo, and take a tour of the Theodore Roosevelt inaugural site.
